people of Premier follow Tague Lumber's commitment of cultivating strong personal relationships based on expertise and honesty, while providing top-quality products with excellent value.



"Jackson is a family business, too. I learned how to hang doors, load trucks, custom mill, and more. The company is technologically advanced, so I gleaned many ideas to bring to Tague. It was at Jackson that I began to fall in love with family business. If I see a problem, I can ask questions and affect change very quickly. Tague believes in Premier, and I see how poised the company is to add business, especially along the Route 202 corridor. I made the right job selection," asserts a smiling Tague.
